TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM

Our Transportation Program continues to serve the children of Indiana and their need to be transported to appointments at Riley Hospital. In my last column (November Newsletter), I explained the process we follow if a person needs transportation. A brief recap might help remind you of the steps I take to help families:

- 1. I receive a call from a Riley Social Worker asking for transportation. At this point, the activity becomes a Kiwanis event.
 - 2. I ask for name of patient, age, and date and time of appointment. I also ask for the patient's address and phone number.
 - 3. I call the Riley Advocate in the Kiwanis Division where the patient lives, and I give him/her the information I received from the Riley Social Worker.
- 4. The advocate then calls the club president of the club in the vicinity of the patient who identifies a potential driver. The club president communicates the name of the driver and his/her phone information to me, so I can contact the driver. It helps to have an email address as well, in case I cannot reach the driver by phone or text message. I am then able to call the Social Worker with the driver information.

If you agree to drive, please do the following:

- 1. Phone the family immediately to assure them you plan to drive.
- 2. They are responsible for all car seats needed for their family. They need to install them in your car themselves.
 - 3. Two days before the appointment, call them again to assure them you will be there.
 - 4. Access the Release/Consent Form. (find this on the Indiana Kiwanis website).

Since my last column, I have had questions concerning the liability of drivers who agree to transport. Our release/consent form is a good start for you. Please download the form and have the family sign it. I consulted the Risk Management Contact for Kiwanis International, Mr. Stu Peterson for further information on protection, and he told me that when we agree to transport the child, the event is then a Kiwanis event. So, the driver and the family are covered. Your vehicle is not covered, but you should have your own Automobile Insurance that covers vehicle damage. I hope this helps understand that aspect of transportation.

Finally, I want to give a shout out to Diane Masterson from Evansville Green River, who tried valiantly to find a driver for a family (baby, mother and grandmother).

RILEY CHILDREN'S HEALTH INTEGRATED CARE UPDATE

Significant progress has been made toward the goal of implementing pediatric behavioral health services into primary care offices.

- · We have:
 - · Launched evidence-based mental health services at the first two pilot sites:
 - Riley Pediatric Care Center in downtown Indianapolis, which serves more than 4,400 patients
 - · Riley Physicians Pediatrics in Mooresville, which serves nearly 4,000 patients
 - Identified an additional 20 practices across the state, which are being randomized into three waves for
 implementation. Our first wave of sites launching in January 2024 will serve over 20,600 patients. The timeline for
 second wave is June 2024, and January 2025 for the third wave.
- Built a team of 2 BSWs and 1 LMHC and will onboard 3 more BSWs in December for the first wave of sites.
- Launched virtual group-based therapies for common pediatric behavioral health needs, and we are enrolling for future groups
- Received an IRB approval and have begun implementation science research focused on how primary care providers and clinic staff respond and adapt to the integration process

- Completed many steps towards getting the KCAT assessment tool integrated into Cerner (EHR) and are on track to finalize
 the contracting stage before the end of 2023.
 - These steps towards the full integration of KCAT will allow for comprehensive universal assessment at well child checks
- Established a partnership with IU Bloomington's Clinical Psychology BS program to place undergraduate students for their
 practicums within the pediatric integrated care program as a part of a workforce development pipeline.
 - We are taking 4-5 students for a Spring 2024 placement. Starting Fall 2024, students will take a full academic year
 placement, be fully trained in the evidence-based intervention being provided by our bachelor's level staff (FIRST),
 and they will be able to see a small panel of patients under supervision and get experience in clinical practice,
 documentation, and team collaboration. When the students graduate, they will be eligible for a number of job
 placements within our program and be able to start fully trained.
